Extensive resources for working with culturally and linguistically diverse patients with cleft and craniofacial conditions will be provided.

- ◆ Outline perceptual and instrumental assessment measures used for evaluation of articulation patterns and resonance traits related to cleft palate or velopharyngeal dysfunction
- ◆ Examine treatment measures utilized for articulation errors related to cleft palate or velopharyngeal dysfunction
- ◆ Explain considerations needed for evaluation and treatment of individuals with cleft lip/palate from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds

- ◆ Surgical options for individuals with resonance distortion secondary to velopharyngeal dysfunction
- ◆ Therapeutic treatment options for individuals with articulation errors related to velopharyngeal function
  - ◆ Considerations for assessing and treating individuals with cleft lip/palate from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, including background, rationale, and resources

## About the Presenter

Kelly Nett Cordero, Ph.D., CCC-SLP is the bilingual/craniofacial speech-language pathologist for the Center for Craniofacial Services and the Speech Language Pathology and Audiology Supervisor at Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare in St. Paul, Minnesota. She completed her Ph.D. with a focus on cleft palate speech and bilingual speech development at the University of Minnesota – Twin Cities.



Dr. Cordero has worked with patients with cleft palate and craniofacial conditions for over 12 years and has provided clinical or educational services in six other countries. She has delivered numerous presentations locally, nationally, and internationally on topics related to cleft palate and bilingualism. She has worked with Operation Smile International on development of a formalized protocol for assessment of cleft palate speech in Spanish and also completed surgical trips as a speech-language pathologist with Rotaplast International. She is an expert listener for the Americleft Speech Outcomes Project, which recently received NIH funding support.
